# Online Safety Update

Parenting in a digital world can be tough. Our children are more tech-savvy than ever before, and keeping up with them is tricky business with technology moving on at a rapid rate.

As a school, we take very seriously our responsibility to educate children about online safety as part of our wider safeguarding commitment. Today's children and young people are growing up in a digital world. As they grow older it is crucial that they learn to balance the benefits offered by technology with a critical awareness of their own and other's online behaviour, and develop effective strategies for staying safe and making a positive contribution online. We have developed a revised online safety policy that focuses specifically on eight different aspects of online education:

- Self-Image and Identity
- Online Relationships
- Online Reputation
- Online Bullying
- Managing Online Information
- Health, Wellbeing and Lifestyle
- Privacy and Security
- Copyright and Ownership

This will be launched with children when we take part in the <u>National Safer Internet Day on Tuesday 5<sup>th</sup> February</u>. On this day, we will be taking part in a whole school assembly and will work in individual classes on key areas. Children will then work on each of these aspects across the school year in line with our revised online safety curriculum.

We also want to make sure that you, as parents, are as informed as you can be. If you visit our website, there is a parent guide for online safety in our safeguarding section, which provides more detail that has been provided by 2Simple. In the summer term, we will be holding an online safety workshop for parents so please look out for this.

# Outdoor PE Kit / Forest School Kit
