This week, we had our first Pupil Voice Meetings of the new year. Our Values Ambassadors have created a consistent way for them all to write the value of the fortnight in their classroom environment and thought about a further way to promote our values by including a song of the fortnight which classes can listen to and sing along to. They are going to launch daily positive affirmations in their classes from next week as well as starting a weekly 'Come and Chat' session for children during one breaktime each week, which our Wellbeing Warriors will run on a rota system. They will also be supporting activities during our Safer Internet Week in February.

Our **School Council** also met and discussed feedback from their peers and have devised some projects they are going to work on, such as reinvigorating and restocking the book sheds in the KS2 playgrounds; revising rules for fixed and game equipment use when on the playground at playtime and they also held their first Smart Schools Council meeting of the year.
