The comments section provided lots of constructive feedback, celebrating areas of strength within the school and areas that parents would welcome development in. Reception and Key Stage One Book Audit

Following the feedback received from the parent questionnaire, this week we have completed an audit of the Reception and Key Stage One reading scheme books. Thank you to the parents for being patient with us whilst this has been completed. We have now added additional titles to the levels and, using some of the money raised via the Key Stage Funds, placed an order for some new books. Could I take this opportunity to remind parents that in order to support us in your child's reading development, that we are expecting children to read for a minimum of 10 mins at least 5 times a week. This support is invaluable and should continue with pupils in all year groups. We are currently looking at developing resources and are planning parent workshops that will be delivered next half term to support parents in this role.
