Illness in School

This week, we have seen an increase in school in child absence due to a range of symptoms / illnesses, many of which do not fall within the identified 'key' COVID19 symptoms. Could I please draw parents attention back to the Salford letter issued last Friday regarding the local advice on testing. As explained in the letter, 'numbers of new coronavirus cases are rising steeply in Salford – we are now one of the top ten areas in the country for coronavirus rates '. The current advice states, 'If you, your child or a family member starts to feel unwell in any way book a PCR test at www.gov.uk/ get-coronavirus-test or call 119. The new variant has a range of symptoms so you should get a test and choose the 'My local authority asked me to get a test' option when prompted. Don't use a lateral flow (rapid) test as these are only suitable for people with no symptoms at all. ' I hope this provides clarity for parents and offers reassurance that as a school community, we are all working together to reduce transmission and in turn, keep the children in school.
