September Drop Off and Collection Arrangements

Due to updated guidance from the DfE, in September, schools will no longer be required to operate a 'bubble system' in school. During the summer break, we will be reviewing our risk assessment and adjusting other areas of provision in school. Changes will be communicated to parents at the start of the Autumn Term.

With regards to the drop off and collection arrangements, we have made the decision that we will continue to operate a staff managed gate system in the morning for Key Stage One and Key Stage Two children. We have found this approach helps to provide a smooth start to the day for both children and staff. The gates will be open from 8:45am until 8:55am, if children arrive after this time they will need to report to the main gate and buzz the office for entry. We would ask that Y1 and Y2 children still enter through the main gate on Fairmount Road for safeguarding reasons, but other year groups may choose between the main gate or the White Horse gate, dependent on which suits their route to school best.

In order to reduce the congestion of parents, collection time will be from 3:20pm to 3:30pm, where parents will be able come onto site to collect their child from a designated place. The collection points will be as follows:

This will be reviewed during the term as required. In September, we will ask parents to update our 'walk home' permission list for our Year 5 and Year 6 children.
