# **Snacks in School**

I would like to remind parents of the school's policy on snacks in school. All children in EYFS and KS1 are entitled to a fruit snack, provided by the nationwide campaign 'School Fruit and Vegetable Scheme'. Children in KS1 can also opt to have toast as an additional snack, payable via ParentPay. Within EYFS and KS1, children should not be bringing in any additional snack items. In KS2, children also have the option to buy toast and/ or can bring in an additional 'healthy' snack item. These snack items may include a piece of fruit, a cereal bar (not chocolate based), a yogurt tube etc. Children should not be bringing in crisps, chocolate bars etc and if they do so , will not be allowed to eat them (i.e. will return them home). Could I also ask parents to avoid nut based snacks for break or as part of packed lunches, as there are children in school with nut allergies. Thank you in advance for your cooperation in this matter.
